may be easy to see through, but how about the one from a group you trust and are expecting money from.

With hundreds of dollars coming to you from the IRS stimulus check, an offer to get it into your account



quicker is tempting, especially when the e-mail looks like it comes from the government.

There have been growing reports of people who are contacted by the IRS over the telephone citing their name, address, telephone number and even social security number claiming the bank account number on file is incorrect. The IRS is trying to direct deposit the money to the account used to pay the taxes, in an effort to get the stimulus programming going quicker. They simply need to verify account information.

Do not be fooled. The IRS will never call you on the telephone and ask you for any personal information. Neither will the IRS ever send you an email. The IRS loves to document all communication with you using standard regular U.S. mail.

The scam artists of the world are using the recent stimulus rebate checks as yet another compelling reason for you to divulge personal information. By the time you hang up the telephone and wonder if it was a legitimate call your personal information is being transmitted around the world, mostly to third world countries and countries that do not honor US law. Within minutes, charges are applied to your bank



account and within hours your complete identify may be stolen.

The cost for you to clean up the mess can be substantial and may have a residual affect that lasts for years.

Don't be taken by these scam artists. It would be much better to get your stimulus check two weeks later than to have your identity stolen. The United States Postal Service guarantees all domestic mail to be delivered with 10 days; so be patient, you'll get your check and not get burned at the same time.



determine what project or initiatives are important for the coming year. Once the list is created there is a fair amount of research and costing required to




fully understand the overall impact to the companies, both from an operation standpoint and from a financial aspect.

business continuity, strengthen security and go green."

Virtualization of the datacenter brings concepts never before imagined. In days past the approach was to have different servers for different functions and the more servers you had the more secure you were. If a server went down it only took one application with it.

Then VMware introduced the concept of virtualization, which meant you could run several virtual servers on one powerful hardware platform. This approach significantly reduced the cost of hardware, electricity, air conditioning and real estate. However, the problem of hardware failure remained, and in a virtual environment, this spelled out disaster. Hardware failures would now take out several servers at the same time. As a result, only non-critical business applications were being virtualized.

Now VMware has virtualized the entire datacenter. Now we cannot only virtualize multiple servers on a single computer but also virtualize multiple computers as a single resource. All the computers in the datacenter are seen as a single resource. Applications can be moved from one piece of hardware to another without the need to stop the applications. Users are unaware what piece of hardware is actually running an application and since the application can be moved while it is still running, the user experiences zero downtime.

Now enrich the experience by establishing performance minimums for business critical applications like Great Plains or XL Reporter and the management software automatically moves active applications to hardware with lighter loads. This process frees up vital computing power and ensures optimal performance for business critical applications. When demand drops, the system automatically moves the applications back to their desired hardware and begins monitoring performance again.

But what about the problem of a single piece of hardware failing and taking down several servers. VMware has addressed that too. The system

will automatically start up a clone of the failed applications on the remaining datacenter hardware from the last snapshot. While this is not a fault-tolerant solution like a true cluster, it will recover data from within a few minutes and more importantly get the company back up and running.

The value proposition is in the savings of multiple servers, electricity, air conditioning, real estate, and now reduced downtime, increased user availability, real time performance optimization, and zero downtime for maintenance.
